

SCHOOL DISCO

CODE OF CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

When Blackbutt State School students attend the school disco, they will be expected to follow school rules even though the event is held out of school hours.

The expectations for school disco behaviour are as follows:

Positive Behaviour-Green Choices and Bucket Filling	Negative Behaviour- Red Choices and Bucket Dipping
<p>We should see you doing this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Walking on hard surfaces;• Keeping your hands, feet and body to yourself;• Staying within the boundaries around the hall- the school forts, oval and the rest of the school are off limits;• Looking after the school gardens by leaving them alone;• Using the stairs to walk down or up sensibly;• Using the stairs handrail sensibly;• Dancing at the disco and enjoying being with your friends;• Eating and drinking outside the hall;• Being kind to others at the disco by helping them and using appropriate language;• Lining up at the tuckshop and be polite to the parents who are serving you;• Leaving the disco with a safe adult such as your parents or someone they have nominated as your safe adult;• Putting your litter in the bin.	<p>We should not see you doing this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Running on cement, gravel, stairs, seats or tops of walls;• Pushing, shoving, kicking, hitting, punching, kissing, hugging without permission and biting others;• Going to other school areas that are unsupervised and not safe;• Pick up sticks and rocks from the gardens and throw them at others;• Slide down the stairs and stair handrails;• Staying on the stairs and blocking the path of others;• Play chasey or tag games outside the hall or in the hall;• Eating and drinking inside the hall;• Using inappropriate language and being mean to others• Running out of the hall before your safe adult arrives;• Pushing in at the tuckshop and showing no respect to the parents serving you;• Dropping your litter anywhere without putting it in the bin.

Consequences:

If you follow the rules and expectations, you will have a good time and enjoy the disco. You will be welcome back to future school discos

If you don't behave well at the school disco, you will be asked to sit in the disco 'timein' area for up to ten minutes. If you continue to misbehave at the disco after being sent to Disco Timein, a representative from the school staff or P&C will contact your parents/carers to collect you from the disco.

The principal or P&C President may contact your parents/carers for a discussion. Your parents/carers may be sent a letter about your poor behaviour at the disco.

If your behaviour is very poor, the principal and/or P&C President may decide that you are not able to attend any future school discos, or may ask parents and carers to accompany you and supervise you at the next disco

Other:

If you are suspended from school at the time of the school disco you are not allowed to attend the school disco until your suspension from school is completed.

OUTSIDE SCHOOL HOURS AND OUTSIDE SCHOOL EVENTS

CODE OF CONDUCT AND BEHAVIOURAL EXPECTATIONS

When Blackbutt State School students attend events held out of school hours, they will be expected to follow school rules even though the event is held out of school hours.

These events include: ANZAC Day March, Blackbutt Avocado Festival, School hall events such as the disco, excursions-held away from school and incursions-held in the school.

The expectations for behaviour are as follows:

<p>We should see you doing this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Following the rules: Be Safe, Be Responsible; and Be an Active Learner;• Wearing the school uniform proudly if this is required for the event;• Keeping your hands, feet and body to yourself;• Being kind to others by helping them• Using appropriate language;• Behaving in a way that ensures you represent Blackbutt State School positively.	<p>We should not see you doing this:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Breaking the school rules of: Be Safe, Be Responsible; and Be and Active Learner;• Behaving in a manner that disrespects our school when you are in school uniform;• Using inappropriate language;• Being rude and disrespectful to others.

Consequences:

If you follow the rules and expectations, you will have a good time and enjoy the school event.

If you don't behave well at school events, your parents/carers may be contacted. They may be asked to take you home from the school event.

If the behaviour is very poor, the principal and/or P&C President may decide that you are not able to attend any future school events outside school hours, or may ask parents and carers to accompany their children and supervise them at the next disco or contact your parents/carers for a discussion.

Other:

If are suspended from school at the time of the school disco, you will not be allowed to attend outside of school hours events either until the suspension is completed.
